AIR FORCE

Rent and utilities:
Free or tax-free allowance

Retirement:
Noncontributory retirement plan, payable after 20 years

Life insurance:
Low cost regardless of health

Work clothes:
Annual tax-free stipend

Vacation:
30 days yearly

Medical insurance and prescriptions:
Free

Dental coverage:
Free

Education:
100 % tuition assistance, GI Bill Benefits and CCAF degrees

Food and Base Exchange:
Free or tax-free allowance, commissary offers 29% average annual savings; BX offers tax-free purchases

Fitness club:
Free use of fitness centers on base

Childcare:
Subsidized at reasonable cost

Recreation:
Low cost golf course, bowling centers, marinas, Armed Forces Recreation Centers, movies and club membership



CIVILIAN

Rent and utilities:
Out of pocket

Retirement:
Less than 40% of civilian firms offer a retirement plan; most are contributory

Life insurance:
Premiums based on health and age

Work clothes:
May be available

Vacation:
Typically two weeks after the first year

Medical insurance and prescriptions:
Premiums and co-payment charges

Dental coverage:
Possibly covered

Education:
Out of pocket or take classes employer approves

Food and Base Exchange:
No allowance

Fitness club:
May be available or will be out of pocket

Childcare:
May be available or will be out of pocket

Recreation:
Out of pocket
