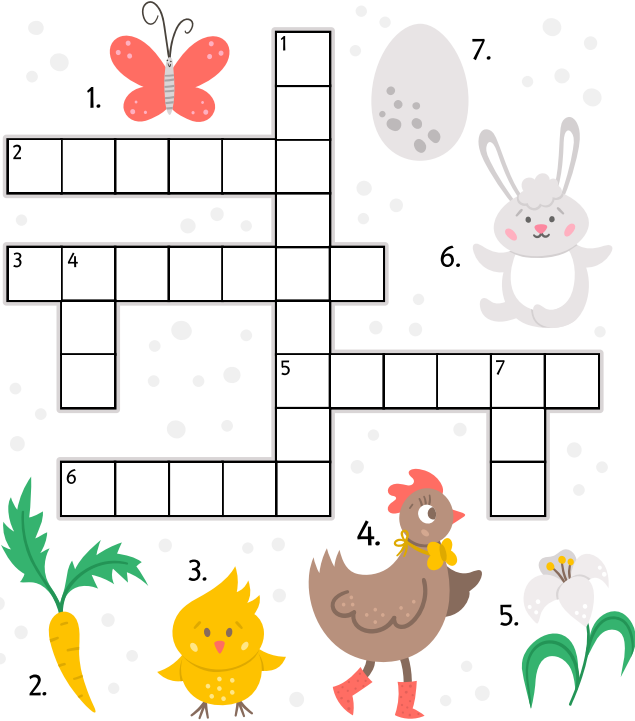

# Supportive Programs For Our Airman, Spouses & Their Children

Military members and families endure a whole host of challenges on top of those faced in everyday “normal civilian” life. Today’s Air Force works overtime to take care of Airmen and their families! Often, just knowing there are resources available can be a saving grace in challenging times. Throughout your military career (active duty or family members alike) you will find a great deal of support through your local Force Support Squadron (1 SOFSS here at Hurlburt Field). We have compiled a list of programs found here and at most bases so we ask you to read over the following programs, snap a picture and save it to your favorites or tear out this article and save it. You may not have a personal need right now, yet it may come in handy some other time for you or even guide you to help another family who is unaware of assistance when life gets tough.

Family Child Care (FCC) • Youth Programs (YP) • School Liaison Program (SLP) • Airman & Family Readiness Center (AFRC) • Family Advocacy Program (FAP) • Base Chapel



**FAMILY CHILD CARE (FCC),  
(850) 884-4300**

Hurlburt Field FCC offers a variety of child care options for various situations. The info below is an overview and specific rules may apply. Consult with FCC for specific cases:

- **Military Spouse Appointment Child Care (NEW)** – Spouses of Active Duty Military who have appointments may utilize FREE child care with a FCC provider during their scheduled appointment time. Documentation of the appointment required, i.e. a medical appointment or a schedule for a job interview.
- **Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) Respite Child Care** - Short-term care to help reduce the stress associated with caring for an exceptional family member. Airman must be Q-coded and exceptional member identified with a disability as “moderate” or “severe”. Available to active duty AF, and Activated Reserve/Guard members.
- **Subsidy** - Assist families with the utilization of FCC homes by offsetting the fees so they mirror what a family qualifies to pay at the on base Child Development Center (CDC). Eligibility: Active duty military member, activated Guard Member or DoD Civilian. All adults living in the household must be working or enrolled in school full-time.
- **Extended Duty** – After-hour care provided when the parent is working an extended duty day beyond the hours of operation at their regular child care facility, temporary shift change not to exceed 3 days, working federal holidays when regular child care facility is closed or rapid mobilization until alternate child care is arranged.
- **FCC 24/7** - Assist parents when regular work schedules are outside normal operating hours: shift workers and personnel required to work overnight, holidays and/or weekends.
- **Deployment and Remote Assignment** - Support when a military member is deployed for a contingency operation or on remote assignment, 16 hours of free care, per month, per child.
- **Home Community Care** - Provides care for members of the Guard and Reserves during scheduled drill weekend.
- **Emergency Medical** - Assists families experiencing a medical emergency with immediate family members.
- **Wounded Warrior Care** - Assist families when Wounded Warrior has medical and/or military appointments.
- **Fallen Warriors** - Assists families attending estate matter appointments for a fallen military family member.
- **PCS for Army, Navy and Marines** - 20 hours of free child care as military member is arriving or departing the base. Contact: FCC office at 884-4300 / or A&FRC at 884-5441 for more info.





**YOUTH PROGRAMS (YP),**  
**(850) 884-6938**

Servicing school-aged youth from 5-18 years old.

- **Anchored4Life** - A peer-to-peer club to connect youth while building transition and resiliency skills. The club provides opportunities for peers to enhance social skills, learn leadership skills, build character, improve self-esteem, and integrate into their community. The program provides a point of contact for our center which means we will always have a lifeline to stability and structure.
- **Youth of The Year** - The best military youth compete through the Military Youth of the Year program, a premier scholarship and recognition program for teen's ages 14-18 offered in partnership with Boys and Girls Clubs of America.
- **Open Rec and Teen Program** - Youth Programs provides positive youth development by supporting the skills, interests, qualities, and abilities of all youth through interactive programming and events.
- **Leadership Clubs** - Torch Club (Pre-teens), Keystone (Teens), and Air Force Teen Council (AFTC).
- **STEAM** (science, technology, art, engineering, and mathematics) - We assist with access to International Space Station tracking, 4-H National Youth STEM Challenge, 3-D Printers, robotics, engineering, and more.
- **National Arts Contest and ImageMakers Photography** - Compete at the local level and submit to Regional and National contests.
- **Youth Sports** - Offering non-competitive clinics/skill development for ages 3-11.
- **Power Hour** - Homework help and volunteer tutoring opportunities for teens.
- **Facebook** - Hurlburt Field Child & Youth
- **Operation MegaPhone** - This dynamic initiative invites teens across the Department of Defense to come together to celebrate, share, and raise awareness about military teen programs. OMP is an initiative designed "by teens, for teens" to connect and build partnerships, raise awareness, and reach out to teens in the community.



**SCHOOL LIAISON PROGRAM (SLP),**  
**(850) 884-6355 or cell (850) 280-5766**

The SLP helps with anything school-related. Having issues registering without a current address after PCS? Need assistance with transcript transfers? Transition issues of any sort? Need resources for your military-connected student? The SLP is your one-stop-shop!

- **SLP Connection** - Child and Youth Behavioral Military and Family Life Counselors (CYB-MFLCs) - Provides private and confidential non-medical counseling service, consent from parent or guardian is required. CYB-MFLCs are in the environment to augment services provided by the schools and DoD to include "walk-around" coaching, support and counseling to military children, youth, families and staff. They offer supportive services to all children, both thriving and struggling, with daily activities to build or strengthen resiliency.
- **Facebook** - Hurlburt Field School Liaison Program



**AIRMAN & FAMILY READINESS CENTER (A&FRC),**  
**(850) 884-5441**

The primary focus of the Airman & Family Readiness Center (A&FRC) is to support readiness by helping families and single military members adapt to the demands of the Air Force. The center designs, develops and conducts quality of life programs to develop important skills and foster a strong sense of Air Force Community.

- **Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)** - Provides information and assistance to families with special needs: resources, support groups, events, networking opportunities, and a voice.
- **Information & Referral (I&R)** - Connects families with a variety of services and resources on or off base as needed.
- **Discovery Center** - Resource library with information on transition, relocation, deployments, employment, and more. Computers, copier, scan, printer, and fax services available.
- **Experiential training** - Interactive team building and education through group activities.
- **Volunteer Resource Program (VRP)** - Provides recruitment, assessment, and placement of volunteers for on and off-base opportunities.
- **Installation Voting Assistance Officer** - The (IVAO) provides information and help to ensure you are able to exercise your right to vote "wherever you are."
- **Air Force Families Forever (AFFF)** - Support available to family members who have lost an Airman. (Gold Star Families)
- **Financial Readiness Program** - Accredited financial counselors (free), One-on-one budget and debt counseling, identity theft, credit reports, fico scores, etc. Classes and briefings cover home buying, car buying, tsp/brs, and credit awareness.
- **Air Force Aid Society (AFAS)** - Emergency financial assistance: assistance provided for basic living expenses, auto repairs, non-covered medical/dental care, and emergency travel. Bundles for Babies (for expecting parents), AFAS education grant, Child Care for PCS (see pg 11)

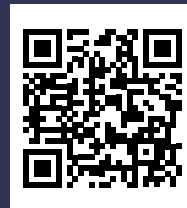

**Relocation Assistance Program** - Educate incoming and outgoing families on the pcs/transition process and resources.

- **Welcome Spouse/Coffee and Connections** - An orientation to Hurlburt field programs and services.
- **Newcomers Orientation** - Briefing for all inbound personnel to learn about community resources to help adjust to Hurlburt Field.
- **Child Care For PCS** - 20 hours of free child care (per child) within 60 days of PCS'ing in or out.
- **Sponsorship Training** - Briefing designed to provide sponsors with tools to effectively help transitioning Airmen and families.
- **Key Spouse Program (KSP)** - Volunteers appointed by the commander and trained to help maintain connections between the family and the unit.
- **Personal/Work Life Program (P&WL)** - One-on-one consultations and/or classes on: stress management, team building (workshops upon request), communication (couples and work), parenting concerns, education, adjusting to military life, resiliency techniques and professional growth.
- **Heartlink - Military Spouse 101** - This workshop introduces new Air Force spouses to military traditions, protocol, the mission, resources, etc. A tour of the deployment control center (DCC) is included. Graduating spouses will receive a military coin!
- **Family & Personal Readiness Program** - Provides individual and family assistance before, during and after: deployments, remote tours, TDY's, emergencies, and disasters/evacuations.
- **Hearts Apart** - Support for families during times of separation through: monthly events, weekly email, and information as needed.
- **Employment Assistance Program** - One-on-one consultations based on client needs: resume, interview, and job search assistance for federal and private sector; networking, salary negotiation, and dress for success tips. Provide skills inventories and labor market research and help with school & scholarship applications. Classes: Resume Readiness, The Art of The Interview, LinkedIn, Spouse Employment Ready, Federal Employment, And Showcasing You!
- **Panhandle Job Fairs** - Spring And Fall
- **Wounded Warrior Program** - Assist seriously injured service members and those diagnosed with life-changing medical conditions and their families in receiving personal services and support.

The Youth of the Year (YOY) program in partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of America creates opportunities for military Youth Center participants to receive recognition at the local, state, regional and national levels. The local YoY serves as a role model for other young people in the Youth Center and as representative of the community and provides opportunities for youth to expand their leadership skills. The local winner may assist volunteering as a coach with the Sports Program at the Youth Center, speak at relevant base events or participate in other community volunteer opportunities. After earning the local title, they go on to compete against other military youth in the state

they reside. If they win at state they will continue on to the regional level, and potentially on to the national level. The local YOY completes an interview process with Youth Center management (directors & program coordinators). Once selected they complete their application, and prepare for their 3 minute YoY speech and interview.

Hurlburt's selectee for 2022 is Jayden Reed. If you know a teen worthy of this title, pass on the eligibility information to the right and be sure to refer them to <https://www.bgca.net/YOY> for some great tips on how to prepare to compete for the following year! ■

#### Applying for Youth of the Year Eligibility

**Requirements:** The Youth of the Year Leadership Suite (available on <https://www.bgca.net/YOY>) includes a preparation guide to help prepare the candidate

Application is submitted online by youth center staff

**Age:** Candidates must be no younger than 14 and no older than 18 years of age on January 31 of the competition year

**Identification:** Candidates must complete a military affiliation verification

**Attendance:** Active member and participant of Youth Center for 2 years prior to January 31 of the competition year (special exceptions may be in order due to COVID-19, see official rules)



# History of Animal Crackers

## Head First, Legs First, All in or Dunk?

“Animal crackers in my soup, monkeys and rabbits loop-the-loop”, this sweet verse sung by the melodious voice of young Shirley Temple resonates through my head any time someone utters the words, “animal crackers”. While I never put them in my soup, though not super sweet they are too sweet for soup, the song reminds me of carefree youthful days, and terrorizing my younger nephew (we are close in age), by biting the heads off his favorite animals.

My first memory of this beloved delicacy is a package introduced by The National Biscuit Company (now Nabisco) in 1902, featuring the animals in cages as if in transport to the circus. I recall us lining them up to look like a train. The boxes had strings which I thought made them look like a purse, which I dutifully put my marbles in, though I learned while researching this article they were originally marketed to have dual purpose and be hung as ornaments on Christmas trees.

A little further research reveals that this gently sweet delicacy was first made in England in the mid-1800's, and imported to the United States in the late 1800's. In 1871, the D.F. Stauffer Biscuit Company (now Stauffer's®) began producing them in Pennsylvania. Stauffer's® offers 13 animals in regular, chocolate, cotton candy, graham and iced. While more flavorful, they are much less detailed than the 53 Nabisco animals, still served using the original recipe from 1902. Several other companies produce their own versions, however it seems the Stauffer's® and Nabisco versions are the most notable ones.

By now, you may be wondering why we are talking about animal crackers April 18 is National Animal Cracker Day, and we thought it might be fun to learn more about this childhood treat. We are also sharing some fun trivia, perhaps you can spend some time with loved ones baking up a delicious batch and talking about your favorite ways to eat them! In case you were wondering, I like the light sweetness of an animal cracker with some tart and tangy lemonade. I put both in my mouth and let the cookie soften before chomping it down – head first, of course (wink, wink)! What about you, are you a head first, legs first, all in at once or a dunking kind of animal cracker indulger? ■

4. How much money has Barnum & Bailey Circus made from Nabisco's use of the Barnum name on their circus box of animal crackers?
5. Why did Nabisco uncage the animals in their packaging?

1. The monkey was featured in pants
2. Before the well-known boxes were used to distribute animal crackers, they were sold in bulk in barrels
3. The recipe calls for less shortening and sugar than most cookies and often have a layered appearance as in the Stauffer's® version resulting in a crispy texture.
4. Not. One. Single. Penny. Yep, since it is just a surname and not directly associated with the circus itself, there have been no licensing fees paid to the famous circus company.
5. To satisfy please from People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (P.E.T.A.) and other animal rights activists, Nabisco decided to feature the animals in a more natural habitat. This coincided with the downturn of travelling circuses as their popularity waned due to the perceived cruelty and unethical behavior inflicted on circus animals.

# USID Card | Q & A

**When does a retiree/dependent get an USID Card?**

No sooner than 30 days before the expiration date. You will need to have 2 UNEXPIRED forms of identification. (Drivers License, SS Card, Current Military ID)

**Do you need to go to Social Security prior to age 65 before you get your new USID?**

No, Social Security does not play a roll in the DEERS process. However, you will need to be enrolled in Medicare Part A and B and you will need to bring proof of enrollment with your Medicare number. (Medicare Card or the Letter you receive in the mail as confirmation)

**At age 65 retirees/dependents will get indefinite USID Cards?**

True, but there are stipulations though. Dependents whose I.D. Card expires prior to their 65th birthday will not receive an indefinite USID. Their USID will be valid for 4 more years and then they will receive an indefinite card. There are no exceptions to this and DEERS agents do not have the ability to make any exceptions.

**Retirees/dependents that have the old-style laminated I.D. Cards do not need the new white USID.**

True, all the data on your old card is the exact same. The new USID will only be issued when a new card is required or needed. DEERS agents cannot and will not issue you the new style USID strictly based on want.

**What are the hours of the Hurlburt Field DEERS/I.D. Card Office?**

We accept walk-in customers all day, every day. Hours are 7:30am-3:15pm Monday – Thursday and 7:30am-3:00pm on Fridays. We are closed on all Federal Holidays and training days. The last Tuesday of every month is a staff training day and hours are 7:30-10:30am.

**When is the best time to get a new USID? When is it not crowded (time of the day, day of the week, week of the month)**

Unfortunately, there is no right answer to this question. The Hurlburt Field DEERS Office processes more than 40,000 transactions a year. The worst time to come though is between 11:00am and 1:00pm. Our service is cut by 50% to allow our employees time for lunch.

**Advice straight from the DEERS Security Manager**

- Never feel like you've brought too much paperwork to us. It's better to have more than you need than it is to not have enough.
- Always keep your address, marital status, and dependency status up to date. Benefits and entitlements are based on this information.
- We understand long wait times are frustrating, we have 5 stations, please be courteous to the agents as they work diligently to meet everyone's needs.

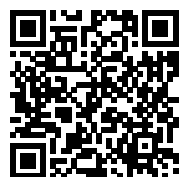

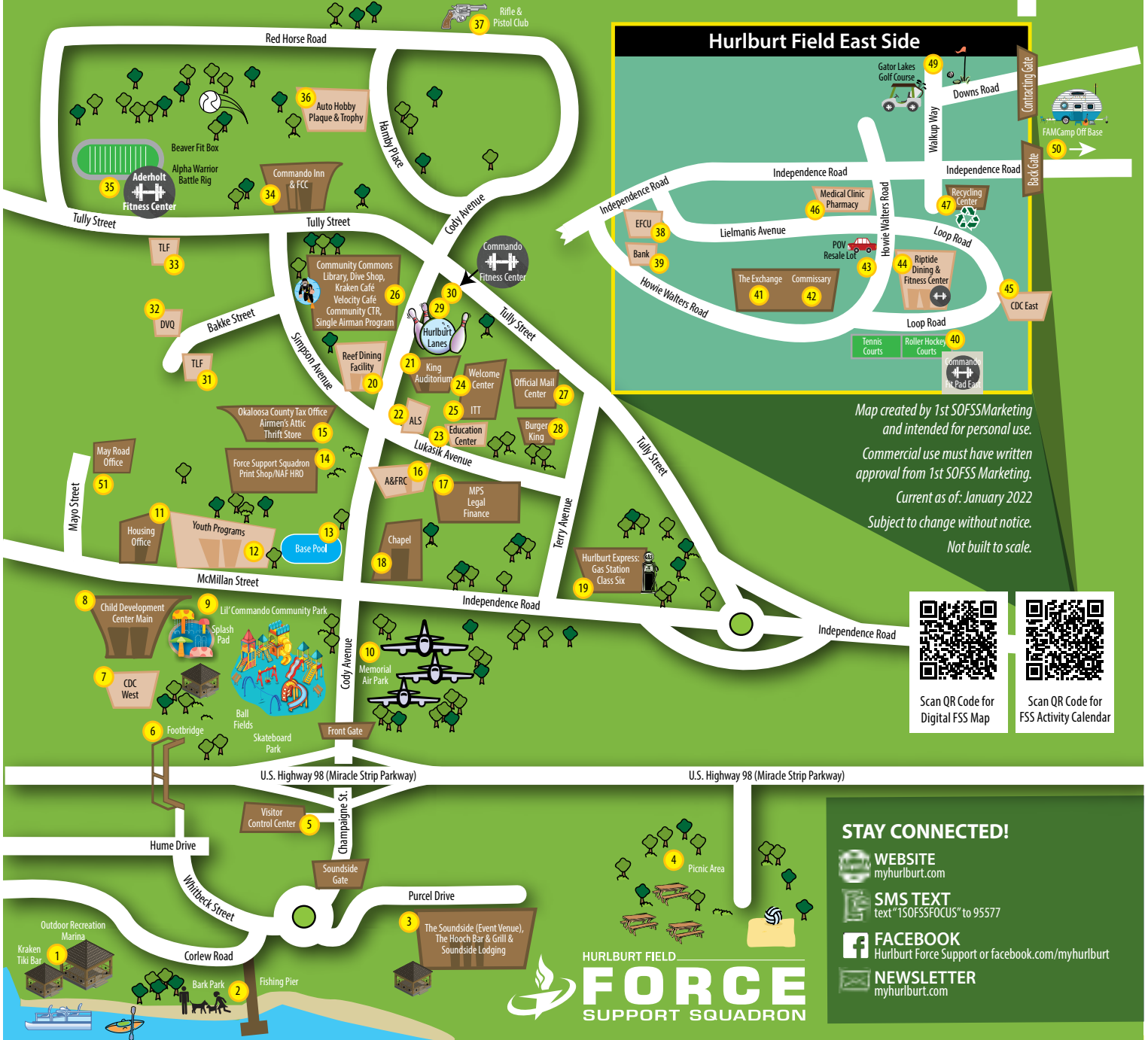
