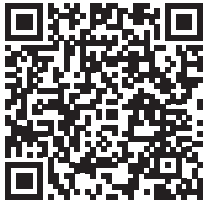

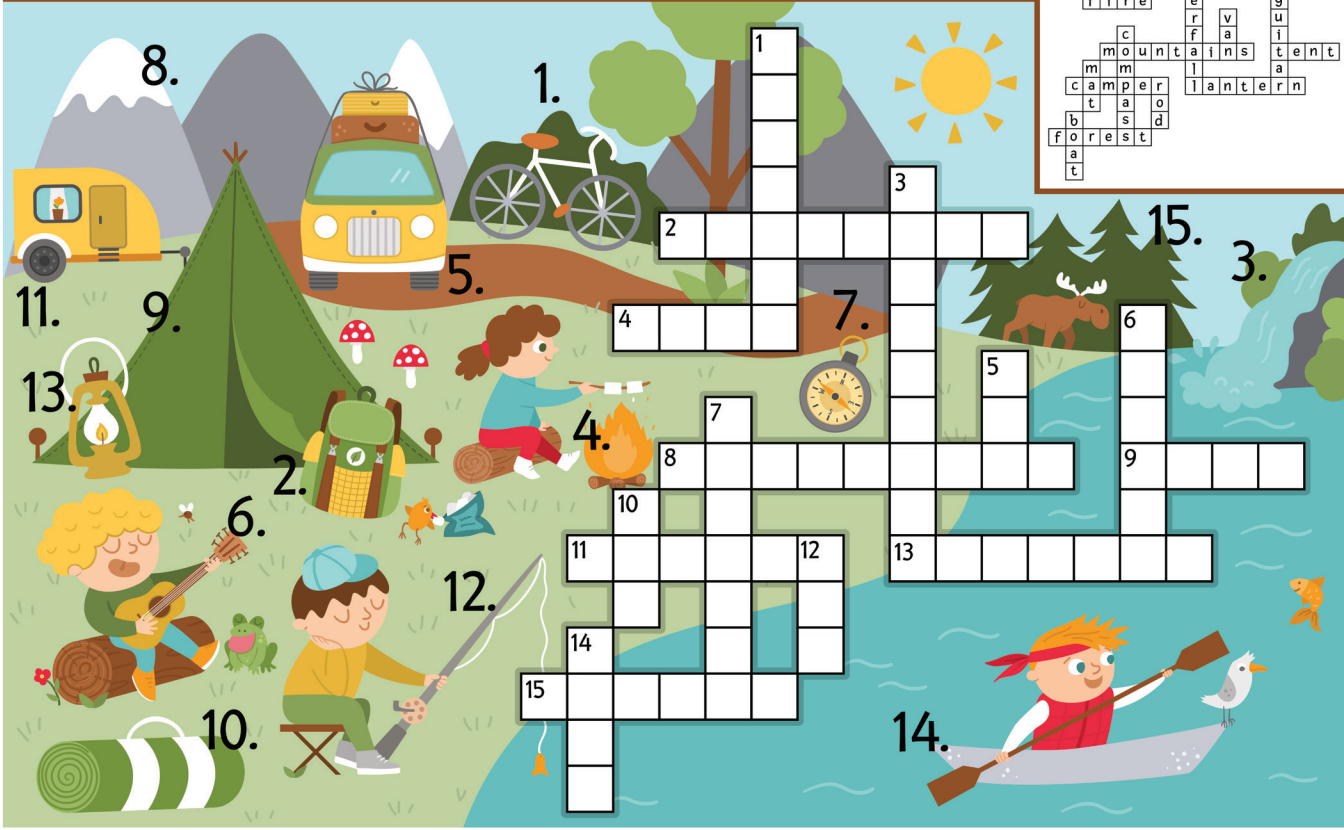
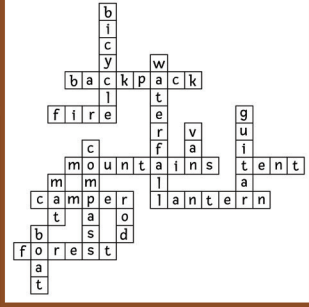

THE MILITARY PERSONNEL FLIGHT

The Military Personnel Flight (MPF) encompasses four sections – Customer Support, Career Development, Force Management, and Personnel Systems Management. All of these sections work together to support every squadron, unit, member, civilian, and dependent on Hurlburt Field.

MPF is well known for their customer service and support when it comes to updating DEERS, getting a new CAC, or updating a life event, but the other three offices provide plenty of support when it comes to a member and their records. Airman (Amn) Darius Fahnbulleh and the rest of the Force Management team work with the Commander Support Staff (CSS) at each squadron to update a member's Enlisted Performance Brief (EPB) and Officer Performance Brief (OPB). Amn Fahnbulleh says, "We are like a mini-Air Force Personnel Center (AFPC). We work with the CSS to ensure all the member's info is correct. We are here to assist."

Amn Fahnbulleh elaborates on the role of the CSS in each squadron. "The CSS gains the new member, in-processes them in their squadron, and then updates their information. While the CSS is in charge of updating their squadron, we, at MPF Force Management, are in charge of all of Hurlburt." He goes on to say that the CSS is there to help you find out what documents you need for your particular situation. For example, if a member needs to adjust their assignment orders to Hurlburt Field after arriving on station, Amn Fahnbulleh and his team work with the member and their CSS to ensure the orders can be amended. "Communication is key with Force Management. If they don't communicate well with the squadron CSS, their static close-out dates (SCOD) are missed," says Amn Fahnbulleh.

Another section of MPF assists members with reenlistments, retirements, or separations. According to TSgt Angellette Jones in retentions at the Hurlburt Field MPF, a member is, "either getting out or staying in," and the MPF is here to assist with processing each of those transitions.



If you've been in the military a long time, you know assignments can drop quickly with only a few weeks to prepare, or on the flip side of that you have several months' notice to get your paperwork and life in order. If you are new to the military, the assignment process can be daunting but MPF is here to help. Airman First Class (A1C) Michael Lawson, in Assignments/Career Development, says in most cases, MPF will send out assignment emails soon after Airmen receive notification of assignment. "Overseas assignments require a little more paperwork on the member's end, such as overseas requirements from your Individual Medical Readiness (IMR) and shot record. We let the member know they need to get going on paperwork." A1C Lawson also wants to make sure the member is aware of the time they have left on their commitment. "You do have to make sure you have enough retainability for us to even draft the orders." Make sure you are proactive about checking your records for these and other forms.

If you decide on a separation or re-enlistment, those choices must be made 120 days out. Waiting until the last few weeks of your current enlistment could delay processing and put you in a no-pay status. TSgt Jones wants to remind those still trying to decide not to wait until the last minute. "We occasionally have Airmen who go into no pay status because they wait until the last minute." MPF will reach out to you once you reflect on their loss roster, so make sure you are checking those emails.

The bottom line is don't wait until the last minute on your assignment checklist or decide if you are going to re-enlist or separate. MPF has a vast knowledge base and can assist you with timelines and paperwork to get you on the right path for your assignment.

Last, but certainly not least is the DEERS/ID card office within MPF. Airman Basic (AB) Brela McCord issues dependent ID, CACs and updates other items into DEERS. They have set duty hours and she says it's quicker to walk in – "we can create an ID in 15 minutes." AB McCord says, "Hurlburt can process upwards of 150-200 CACs per day." She says they mostly process CACs and CAC resets. Resets take about 5 minutes. and making a CAC takes about 7-8 minutes. She wants members and their family members to know you can always call their office before coming in to make sure you have all the proper paperwork. "The sponsor must be present for things like updating births or changing names. If the sponsor is deployed or not available, they can fill out the DD Form 1172 online or go to their nearest DEERS/ID office. The 1172 is loaded into their profile so the dependent can visit the ID card office themselves."

While each office within MPF has its own set of duties, they each work together to create a flight that covers all aspects of military personnel on Hurlburt. The MPF office has trained and knowledgeable technicians available to answer your questions, and if they can't assist with your specific questions the myFSS portal is a good tool to search for your question or to submit a ticket to the Air Force Personnel Center (AFPC).

"During Military Training Days, we use that time to learn more about our sections. MPF can be incredibly busy, so I appreciate that we use those days twice a month to recollect, learn, and prepare for the coming days," says A1C Lawson. A1C Lawson came to Hurlburt Field MPF as his first assignment and takes pride in all the skills he's acquired and customers he's helped. "Regardless of where my first assignment would've been, I wanted to come in and learn as much as possible and provide the best service to members of all sorts."



AB Brela McCord

Has been at Hurlburt Field MPF for over two months. What excites her the most are the growth and learning opportunities MPF offers. Her favorite part of MPF is the people working alongside her, "The experience of working with experts and professionals is what motivates me to do more," says AB McCord. 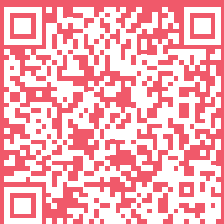

A Deep Dive into Hurlburt's
R4R Programs, featuring
Unite and Single Airman
Initiative Program.

The Recharge for Resiliency (R4R) program is an Air Force wide initiative consisting of Deployed Affected Program (DAP), RecOn, Unite and the Single Airmen Initiative Program (SAIP). These programs aim to foster unit cohesion, culture, and community with Airmen and their families.





Hurlburt Field Unite is a program that unit commanders can utilize to build cohesiveness in their units by targeting specific needs and engaging in morale events for their squadrons. This free program fosters camaraderie and unity within each squadron through fun activities like carnivals, bowling, escape rooms, field days, or volunteer events. Squadrons can also utilize FSS facilities through the Unite program, contributing funds and morale to bolster the Hurlburt community.

The program is open and accessible to Air Force active-duty, guard, reserve, DoD civilians, and their spouses. Squadrons and flights can also put their own spin on the events and craft unique activities. Melanie Lerman, the Community Cohesion Coordinator who oversees the program, enjoys using her skills to bring Unite and the fun that comes with it to every squadron. “My part of the job is helping them gain access to funds, then using my tool sets to help plan an event, which best suits their situation. We are in a unique position to be able to customize events based on unit needs, size, and available

funds.” Every squadron’s needs are different and Ms. Lerman takes pride in being able to help each one reach their goals of making their Airmen feel heard and supported through engaging activities. In 2024, Ms. Lerman aims to expand the utilization of the Unite program amongst more squadrons.

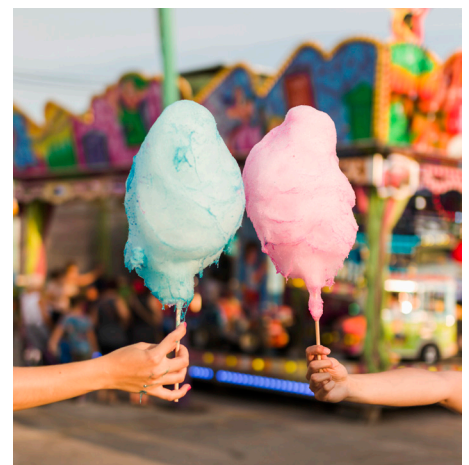

The Hurlburt Field Single Airman Initiative Program provides morale to single Airmen (unmarried) stationed at Hurlburt Field through trips and activities. This initiative aims to help single Airmen explore the area and assist in socializing and uplifting their spirits. Being stationed far from family and friends where you don't know the area or the people can be difficult.

Kari Rosett, the Community Center Director who oversees the SAPI, was born and raised here on the Emerald Coast. She enjoys getting the Airmen in the program out of their comfort zones and showing them the area, "I grew up here and I went full circle to come back home. Being able to show

the Airmen places like Adventures Unlimited, I grew up camping there every summer."

In the program, Airmen can also participate in activities like rock climbing, swim lessons, scuba lessons, and skydiving. The costs for these activities vary between \$5 and \$30 and participation varies by event. Airmen are welcome to visit the Community Center and register with Mrs. Rosett in person 14 days before the activity.

Mrs. Rosett truly values the benefits this program provides to every participating single Airman. "Morale is important. It's hard going to different bases not knowing anyone, starting all over and building up those friendships.

The Single Airman Initiative Program gets those individuals out of their dorm and out of their comfort zones to see all we have to offer on and off base," says Mrs. Rosett.

Single Airmen can look forward to the program kicking off next month and stay up to date on all the upcoming activities by following the Hurlburt Field Community Center on Facebook.

VA Pensions - Are You Eligible?

Veterans Pension: The Veterans Pension program provides monthly payments to wartime Veterans who meet certain age or disability requirements, and who have income and net worth within certain limits this benefit.

VA Survivors Pension: A VA Survivors Pension offers monthly payments to qualified surviving spouses and unmarried dependent children of wartime Veterans who meet certain income and net worth limits set by Congress.

Am I eligible for Veterans Pension benefits?

You may be eligible for the Veterans Pension program if you meet these requirements.

Both of these must be true:

- You didn't receive a dishonorable discharge, and
- Your yearly family income and net worth meet certain limits set by Congress. Your net worth includes all personal property you own (except your house, your car, and most home furnishings), minus any debt you owe. Your net worth includes the net worth of your spouse.

And at least one of these must be true about your service:

- You started on active duty before September 8, 1980, and you served at least 90 days on active duty with at least 1 day during wartime, or
- You started on active duty as an enlisted person after September 7, 1980, and served at least 24 months or the full period for which you were called or ordered to active duty (with some exceptions) with at least 1 day during wartime, or
- You were an officer and started on active duty after October 16, 1981, and you hadn't previously served on active duty for at least 24 months

And at least one of these must be true:

- You're at least 65 years old, or
- You have a permanent and total disability, or
- You're a patient in a nursing home for long-term care because of a disability, or
- You're getting Social Security Disability Insurance or Supplemental Security Income

Am I eligible for a VA Survivors Pension as a surviving spouse?

You may be eligible for this benefit if you haven't remarried after the Veteran's death, and if the deceased Veteran didn't receive a dishonorable discharge and their service meets at least one of these requirements.

At least one of these must be true:

- The Veteran entered active duty on or before September 7, 1980, and served at least 90 days on active military service, with at least 1 day during a covered wartime period, or
- The Veteran entered active duty after September 7, 1980, and served at least 24 months or the full period for which they were called or ordered to active duty (with some exceptions), with at least 1 day during a covered wartime period or
- The Veteran was an officer and started on active duty after October 16, 1981, and hadn't previously served on active duty for at least 24 months

And this must be true for you:

Your yearly family income and net worth meet certain limits set by Congress. Your net worth equals the value of everything you own (except your house, your car, and most home furnishings), minus any debt you owe.

Am I eligible for a VA Survivors Pension as the child of a deceased wartime Veteran?

You may be eligible for this benefit if you're unmarried and you meet at least one of these requirements.

At least one of these must be true:

- You're under age 18, or
- You're under age 23 and attending a VA-approved school, or
- You're unable to care for yourself due to a disability that happened before age 18

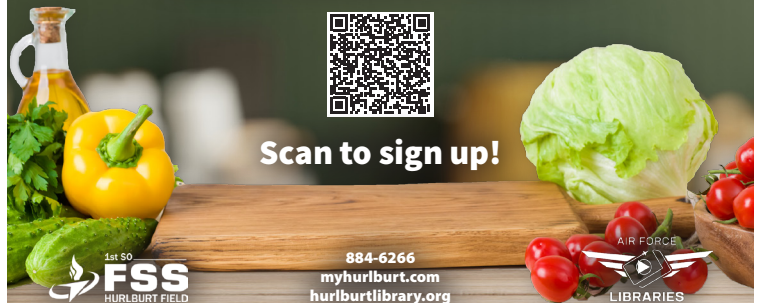

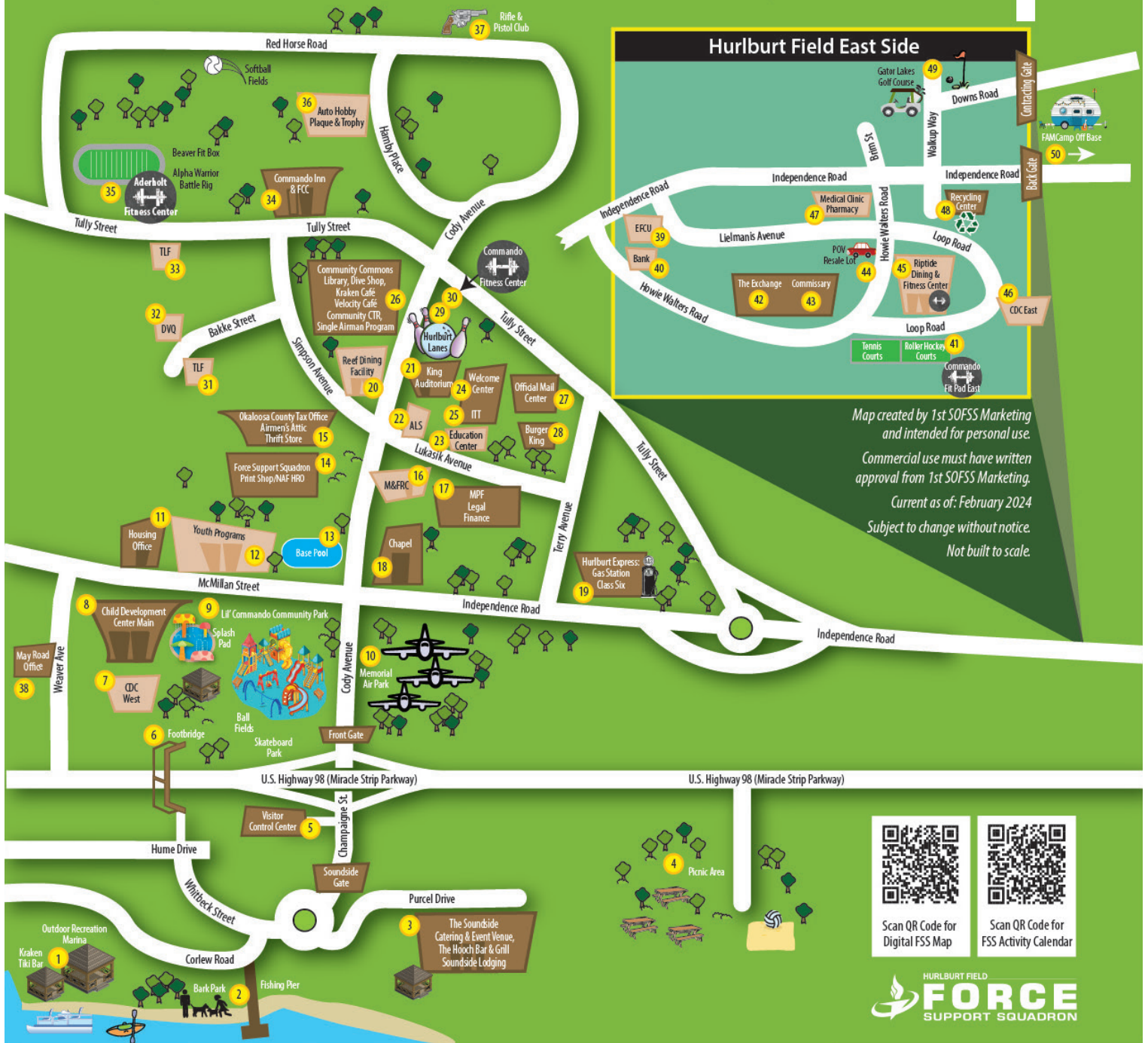
