Herbs, *Marvelous Herbs!*

I didn't really know what herbs were when I was growing up. My mom maybe used dried oregano in her cooking, and I just assumed it was something you could only buy in a jar. In my late twenties, I went to an Italian restaurant in Virginia Beach, Virginia. We were served this focaccia bread (didn't know what that was either) as an appetizer. I could tell it had salt, pepper, parmesan cheese, and I watched the waiter drizzle EVOO (also not a thing in the mid 90's) over the top. As I brought this luscious bread to my mouth, my nose was overcome with an aroma. It was something I had never smelled, almost sweet, almost woody, like Christmas that you eat. I was bursting at the seams waiting to ask the waiter what this amazing scent was. He answered kindly, "fresh rosemary," and looked at me in disbelief when I remarked, "I thought that was just some girl's name in a Simon and Garfunkel song!". I should say, I am not the village idiot, my mom grew up in a small town in Tennessee and while she is an amazing cook, her style is relegated to traditional southern style, which is seasoned primarily with salt, pepper, and hog jowl!

I couldn't wait to find this fresh rosemary stuff and duplicate this recipe at home. To my surprise, I found several other herbs and began to wonder how they were used. Over time, as my culinary skills expanded, I discovered many uses from making fresh teas, to greatly enhancing any dish. Now I use them in cold salads, fresh fruit, and sometimes just to provide a flavor burst in my water. I use them so much now, I cannot afford the expensive little packs from the grocery store. The great thing about living in Florida is you can grow several herbs outside about 9 months out of the year and continue inside if you want. My chives seem to thrive year-round. The best part is, once you learn various herbs' likes and dislikes, they are pretty easy to grow too! Continue reading for a few tips, why not pick a few favorites and give them a try this summer? Almost all of them are great, paired with your favorite oil and vinegar and a little salt and pepper for a quick fresh salad dressing, or frozen in ice cubes for a pretty summer beverage, or frozen in your favorite oil to pop into a dish when it is out of season and still get fresh picked flavor!

Rosemary: This herb is actually in the mint family, yet looks nothing like mint! It is quite fragrant and unlike most herbs, is actually stronger fresh than it is dried. I enjoy it much better fresh, so if you have only had it dried, give fresh a try before you decide if you like it. Rosemary grows like an evergreen shrub and will actually live year-round in the Florida panhandle, especially when planted in the ground and well established. It is pretty drought tolerant and prefers moderate watering.

Mint: Probably one of the easiest to grow and has a variety of uses. Be mindful of the variant though and do your research before planting. Spearmint makes a beautiful groundcover which means it TAKES OVER wherever you plant it. Regular peppermint tends to keep itself contained and is less invasive. As for uses, you can infuse store bought teas or make your own tea by steeping a few leaves. I like to squeeze a mandarin orange in mine for a calming nightcap. You can also pour steeped mint water in a refreshing bath. Some say strain the leaves – I like to add fresh ones to the bath for the aesthetic appeal. Mint is great for adult beverages or to enhance your water (sparkling or not). I love putting a stalk of mint in sparkling lime water with a long cut sliver of cucumber for a cooling summer sipper. Cut up some fresh watermelon, cucumber, cantaloupe and pineapple into tiny cubes, then add chopped mint for an extra special fruit salad! Looking for a natural way to ward off ants? Those pesky sugar ants that like to come in the house in summer really dislike mint – place a small bunch near their entry point and refresh it every few days to keep them away. Mint can also be used to make your own hair rinse, mouthwash, cool a sunburn and more. The varieties are pretty endless – I found Chocolate Mint quite interesting to chew on!

Basil: It is a bit sensitive to hot evening sun and really drinks up the water. Despite this, it is surprisingly resilient. I have forgotten to water mine only to find shriveled up leaves. As long as they are still soft, you can water it and by morning those leaves will perk right back up! Just keep in mind, basil in containers will require more frequent watering than in the ground. One of my favorite herbs, from bruschetta with fresh mozzarella and balsamic glaze, to everything Italian, to a creamy, spicy basil chicken toss, basil is quite versatile! Make sure when harvesting, to cut tender, light colored stems. If you cut the “woody” stems they may not sprout new leaves. Basil is also delicious in sparkling water, beverages or even with a splash of juice. You will find different varieties in this area: Lemon Basil, Sweet Basil and Thai Basil are most common.

Flat Leaf Parsley and Chives: Throw them in a pot and neglect them and they will live year ‘round, most years, in the Panhandle. Water them when they look a little limp and that is about all they require. Both have many uses as a garnish and flavor enhancer. That is partly why I put them together, along with their ease of growing, they are great for first time herb gardeners! Trim them to the base when you need them and they will begin to regenerate in a couple of days. For chives, the purple flowers are pretty, but keep them plucked when they appear to continue producing and not get bitter.

Thyme: Delicate in appearance and robust in flavor. This herb is easy to grow and makes a pretty groundcover, but needs to be pruned or it will become leggy and stop producing flavorful leaves. I find it easier to grow in a wide pot to give it room to spread, but not so much you cannot keep up with it. This is another herb I prefer fresh!

These are a few of my favorite herbs to grow because I use them often and cannot justify spending what it would cost to buy them fresh each week. I have grown Oregano and just found I did not use it as much. I attempted Cilantro. If you figure this one out, please tell me what I am doing wrong, my homemade salsas will thank you! Tarragon is a lovely herb, newer to me as I discovered it in a Mediterranean style orzo pasta and have now used it in chicken dishes and really enjoy the unique flavor – I have not tried to grow it just yet!

We hope to spread a positive message to anyone who is new to Hurlburt or has not seen what the FSS does, and involve them in a welcoming community which helps make military life a little bit easier. With this second part series, we will continue to explain FSS and the other facilities available on base. From Honor Guard, to Child and Youth, to an Auto Hobby Shop, we have it all. Keep reading as we dive into this month's 'What is FSS and Why Should I Care'.

Airman Leadership School (ALS):

An entry level leadership enhancement course to prepare Senior Airmen and/or Guardians for positions of greater responsibility by strengthening their ability to lead, follow, and manage, while also gaining a broader understanding of the military profession and their role within the Air and Space Forces. ALS teaches a 24-day curriculum, where they focus on the topics of history, problem solving, communication, leadership, space, NATO, interpersonal relationships and supervisory skills. This program is for SSgt selects (E-4 promoting to E-5), and is a pre-requisite to becoming SSgt. Their primary focus is enlisted professional military education, and their focal point is helping people in general; not just in career development, but how they can take the lessons they learned from ALS and apply it to their daily lives. While Airmen and Guardians get to reflect and learn new things within the classes, they also find themselves growing in the new friendships they have formed. They get to experience a sense of community, and meeting new people outside of their career field, where they can have challenging and deep conversations, discuss work dynamics or struggles they have to overcome. With the help of each other, ALS students can reflect on their own career and their personal growth, "pouring into their own cup," you might say. It can help them determine what they can do better in their career, or if they see someone who is enjoying their job, encourages them to consider retraining into something they may find more satisfying. They gain leadership skills, new perspectives on life, and new ways to handle things if they are struggling or going through bad times.

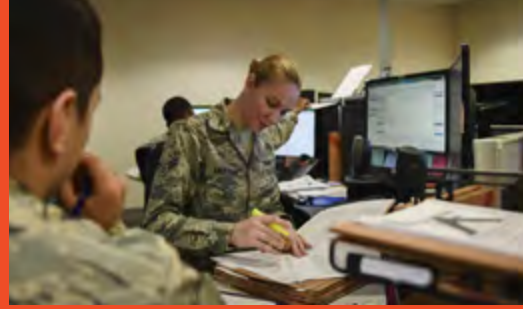
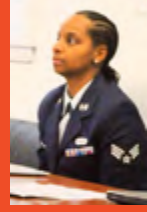


Career Assistance Advisor (CAA) & Professional Development Center (PDC):

A Career Assistance Advisor has many roles and responsibilities. The CAA stands as a highly-visible and knowledgeable source of career guidance to Airman at all levels of their career, and is officially responsible for retaining and professionally developing Airmen. From the Airmen's arrival at their first duty station in the Professional Development Center (PDC), through their development planning journey to their separation from service, CAAs meet Airmen where they are in their military career. CAAs are first and foremost, a counselor to all Airmen with regards to career paths, re-enlistments and retraining opportunities. They help Airmen identify their strengths and weaknesses, become better leaders and improve teamwork, and show how they can broaden their skills. CAAs are also available to help Airmen or Guardians if they are thinking about separating from the military, and the steps in order to do so. CAAs manage the Professional Development Center (PDC). The PDC provides a structured program to transition Airmen from a basic training mindset to a mission-oriented environment. They provide orientation-type information and reinforce lessons learned in basic training to aid in successful transition to their very first base location and assignment.

Military Personnel Flight (MPF):

Provides direct services that may help in any of the 5 sections: Customer Support and Service, Career Development, Force Management, Installation Personnel Readiness and Personnel Systems Management. They are your go to if you need help with ID cards, dependent updates, promotions, enlistments or separations, evals and duty statuses, scheduled deployments, and the steps to take when preparing for them, email accounts or software setups, and much more. They strive to provide timely, quality and reliable customer service to military members and their families, data accuracy in personnel transactions and deliberate development, both personal and professional.

Why should I care?



Manpower Organization:

The Manpower and Organization Flight (1 SOFSS/FSM): Manpower and Organization is dedicated to providing management services to commanders and manpower liaisons throughout the 1st Special Operations Wing. These services include Management Advisory Studies, analyzing/determining the most efficient and effective use of manpower resources, and providing support to wing mobility planning. The office also provides guidance on strategic sourcing and organization structures. The Manpower and Organization flight is there for all of the behind the scene efforts when it comes to providing advice on manpower resource requirements, managing the wing's unit manpower document and plans for exercises and contingencies. Manpower engages with leadership when they say "we need more authorizations" and provides feasible options. They make sure the authorizations meet an existing standard; they check if there is growth or downsizing within the organization and provide guidance about the positions. Manpower also has a hand in real world exercises, where they also focus on war and exercise planning, building packages, looking at taskings that come through and validating them. They create plans that are plug and play, meaning if the wing responds to a hurricane or a disaster, they validate what authorizations will be needed to react to the disaster. They are always on their toes, and make sure to focus on continuous process improvement, and finding the most efficient way to get the work done.



Honor Guard:

Ceremonial Guardsmen honor individuals who served in the United States Air Force. They perform various ceremonies throughout the surrounding area, covering Alabama and Florida, with their primary mission being funeral honors. Guardsmen pride themselves in making sure that they are SHARP, CRISP and MOTIONLESS. These airmen are able to leave their original specialty, and volunteer to become a part of the program that will last 8 months. The initial 2 weeks feature fundamental basic training. Once their foundation is built, the members' comprehensive training will continue 2-3 more months. They focus on even the smallest details, down to the slightest hand placement. Striving to make their uniform as perfect as possible, because they aim to be the best representation of, not only Hurlburt Field, but the United States Air Force, as well. From this intense training, they learn to build communication skills and teamwork with their comrades that will be used when performing retirement services and funeral honors. Their razor sharp performance demonstrates the respect and honor they hold for every service member. Once their 8 months are up, the guardsmen take with them the importance of respect, honor and an understanding of why training and hard work has to be so precise.



Auto Hobby Shop:

The Auto Hobby Shop is a place for people who either enjoy working on their vehicles, or those who just need a quick oil change. Staff are available Tuesday-Sunday. They pride themselves in their self-help service that allows you to pull in and work on your motor vehicle any time you would like! The shop provides fee based services, like brake repairs, timing belts, water pumps and suspension repairs. Guests may also receive a 15-point vehicle inspection for a price you won't see at any off-base location! One awesome thing you may not know is that they have their own operational paint room! With 8 lifts and 11 stalls, a prep room, welding bay, and free oil and filter disposal, you can accomplish most self-help tasks. There are qualified mechanics on hand to assist with your motor projects. You may also book an appointment if there are other services you may need. Who is Eligible?

Recharge for Resiliency (R4R):

R4R programs provide support and funding for specific groups to build resiliency. Who qualifies for FREE or REDUCED FEE R4R events and trips? Below are the four programs that fall under R4R: Single Airman (SAIP), RE-CON (RECON), Deployed Affected Program (DAP) that distinguish the differences and who is eligible to participate in these programs:

Single Airman Program (SAIP):

The Single Airman Program is open to single Air Force active duty members and one guest. This is a time where single airmen can get out of their shell and see the local sights, and relish in activities such as hiking, white water rafting, tubing, fishing, etc. Other fun activities offered are tandem skydiving, getting a scuba diving certification, learning how to surf, and overnight trips out of state like New Orleans! When you find yourself bored and needing to get out of the dorms, your house, or just feel like you are in a funk and need to relieve some stress, the Single Airman Program is there for you. RecOn (RECON):

Rec-On gives Active Duty Military members stationed at Hurlburt Field, and their immediate dependents a chance to experience high adventure activities at amazing prices! Many of the activities are centered on the water, like deep sea and inshore fishing (both are chartered), shark fishing, kayak fishing, and others. RecOn gives Airmen and their families the opportunity to join together and make fun memories, while engaging outdoors and being active. Deployed-Affected Program (DAP):

DAP allows service members who are soon-to-be or currently deployed, and their dependents to participate in recreational events that are educational, recreational, historical, and/or cultural in nature. The best part is although service members may miss out on some of the monthly events, once they return to home station, they are able to attend up to one year following deployment! Some activities offered in the past include visiting the Gulf Breeze Zoo, where they have a special animal presentation for deployed families, Painting with a Twist, Axe throwing, Urban Air, DIY workshops, glass-bottom boat tours, and so much more! DAP is here to give that little nugget of excitement to look forward to each month to help cope with separation a little bit easier. Service members deal with long separation from family members and the families encounter the challenges that come with deployments on the home front. This lifestyle is tough, and deployment puts a big strain on families, so these fun events give families the extra push to get through the hard times, and once their service men and women come back, they are able to attend the events together. The best part is these programs are offered for FREE! Call for details (850) 884-5441

UNITE C3:

With UNITE, Commanders are given the ability to hold events within their squadrons to get together in either small or large groups, and do recreational activities that allow them to build morale and resiliency together. Money is allocated based on civilian and military headcounts. It is a time for everyone to get out of the day-to-day responsibilities they face at work, and have fun! Activities that may be of interest to squadrons are the facilities offered here at Hurlburt like bowling at Hurlburt Lanes, golfing at Gator Lake Golf Course, or renting boats from the Marina. They can choose to do axe throwing, indoor rock climbing, laser tag, escape rooms, and other invigorating activities downtown. These types of get-togethers help boost physical fitness, promote interaction between unit members and foster fun and relaxation for everyone. Child Development Centers (CDC):

There are 3 Child Development Center buildings located on Hurlburt Field, which provide a healthy, respectful, supportive, and challenging learning environment for young children ages 6 weeks to 5 years. They have amazing services that will help the children to learn and grow with appropriate activities focused on enhancing social, emotional, cognitive, and physical development. Each age group is provided a playground, all separated by fencing. There is easy access with climbing structures and toys of all kinds to allow children to experience the fun of being outside in the sun, running around, and getting their energy out. The center provides meals made from scratch, with all of our CDC's following a standardized menu. They serve breakfast, lunch, afternoon snack, and a late afternoon snack. Military families can benefit from CDC's, because they provide a safe place for children while the service men and women are able focus on the mission and can successfully grow in their career.



Family Child Care (FCC):

Services are an alternative to the Child Development Centers (CDC) for families that need full-time care, evening care, weekend care, care for children with special needs, infants, school-age children and care during swing and midnight shifts. Individuals, also known as Providers, must be licensed and certified by the Mission Support Group (MSG) Commander when providing care in their base housing unit for more than 10 hours a week or on a regular basis. They have curriculums for the children that provide them with consistency, fun activities and growing cognitivism. They are able to go out and do fun field trips, such as going to the community park, the Hurlburt Library for some fun reading, or taking a walk. Providers can meet up with other Providers and their groups of kids and have play dates, as well. The FSS also provides 24/7 child care, where they can assist families when their work schedules are outside of normal operating hours of the facility where they are already purchasing full-time care. This program is specifically designed to support shift workers and any personnel who are required to work overnights, holidays, and weekends. This program is fantastic for more 1-on-1 interaction, where the ratio could be one Provider with up to 6 children, or for special needs situations, one Provider with up to 4 children. This allows your children who may be more introverted or are overwhelmed with large class sizes to be more relaxed and enjoy their time with their Providers and the few other children they are with, and have a better time while they await their parents at the end of their work day.



Youth Programs:

The Youth Program is for school aged students 5-18 years of age. They develop programs to foster children's social and physical development, ethics, discipline, self-esteem and leadership: They offer K-6 School Age Care through Before & After School, Spring, Fall and Summer Camps, Open Rec for Pre-Teens & Teens, and Youth Sports. They have many structured programs providing opportunities for youth to develop physical, social, emotional and cognitive abilities. Youth have the ability to roam from room to room, and each room provides different amenities that is beneficial for them. There is a game room where kids can play games and relax, and it has a pinball machine, arcade system, couches for lounging, and a flat-screen TV! When visiting the Youth Center, I was really impressed that they offered an activity room where they have arts and crafts, and can focus on DIY projects, or even gain knowledge of photography equipment. I think those are some awesome skills that children at such a young age can pick up, because I know I certainly was not exposed to photography or creative editing like that when I was younger! There is a learning lounge where youth can get help with homework, find a quiet space to read or decompress from the day. There is yet another room where youth can step into the world of STEM and learn about computer coding, engineering and critical thinking! One thing that the Youth Program prides themselves in is the Outdoor Nature Classroom, where youth can get down and dirty and experience the fun of nature and immerse themselves in an environment that encourages them to use all 5 senses. It gives them the ability to get away from constant technology that we're surrounded with and to go outside, breathe in fresh air, and learn about the eco-system hands on. They also have a Teen Program, where youth 13 years and older can enjoy recreational programs and get help with homework or discuss high school or college plans. The Youth Center is a place where youth can gain a sense of community and make new friendships, as they run around, have fun, and learn new things.

What To Do When Life Changes



Retiree Corner

DFAS MUST KNOW WHEN LIFE CHANGES OCCUR

- Retirees must keep DFAS (Defense Finance and Accounting Service) informed whenever changes happen that could affect retired pay.
- Life-changing events such as marriages, divorces, births, etc., must be reported directly to Retired and Annuitant Pay as soon as possible.

The following are examples of life changing events and how these events could impact your account:

1. **Marriage** – Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP), arrears of pay beneficiary federal income tax.
2. **Divorce** – SBP, arrears of pay beneficiary, federal income tax.
3. **Death of a spouse** – SBP, arrears of pay beneficiary, federal income tax.
4. **Birth of a child** – SBP, arrears of pay beneficiary, federal income tax.
5. **Change of address** – (even if just for the winter months) general correspondence delivery, 1099-R and retiree account statement mailing, state income tax withholding, receipt of Afterburner and make sure that you put your apartment number.
6. **Opening, changing or closing a bank account** – net pay and allotment direct deposit.
7. **Changing the email address stored in myPay** – myPay account change notifications, receipt of Afterburner, myPay notifications for 1099-R and retiree account statement availability.
8. **Paying off and/or closing an insurance policy** – net pay and allotment direct deposit.
9. **By keeping information current in myPay and submitting the appropriate paperwork when a life-changing event occurs**, retirees will help DFAS improve the service it provides.
10. **By reporting these events when they happen**, beneficiaries will have fewer issues and concerns to resolve later.

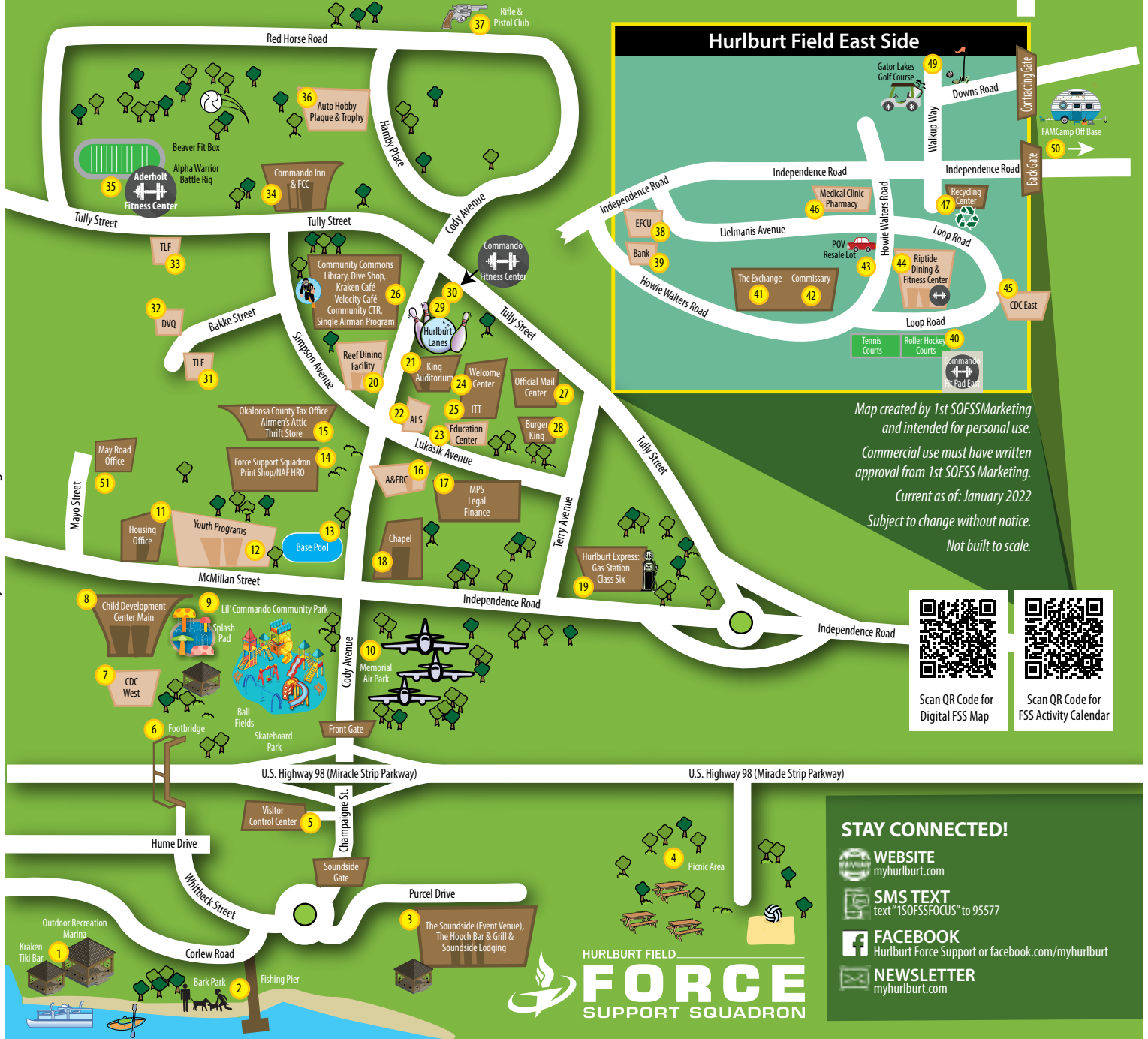
