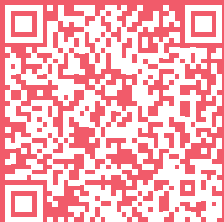

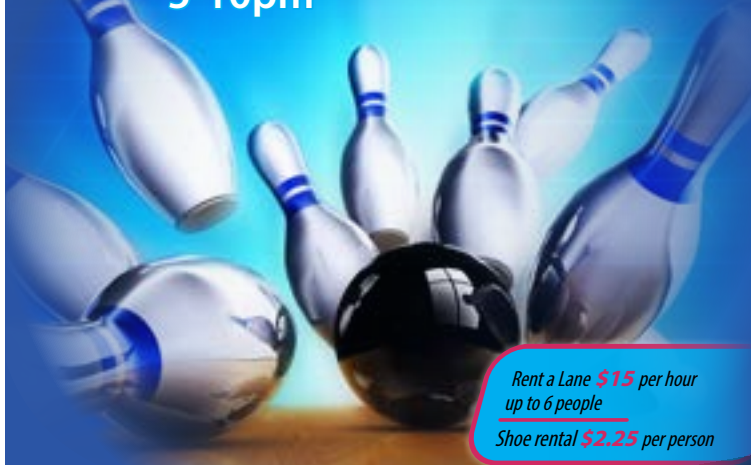

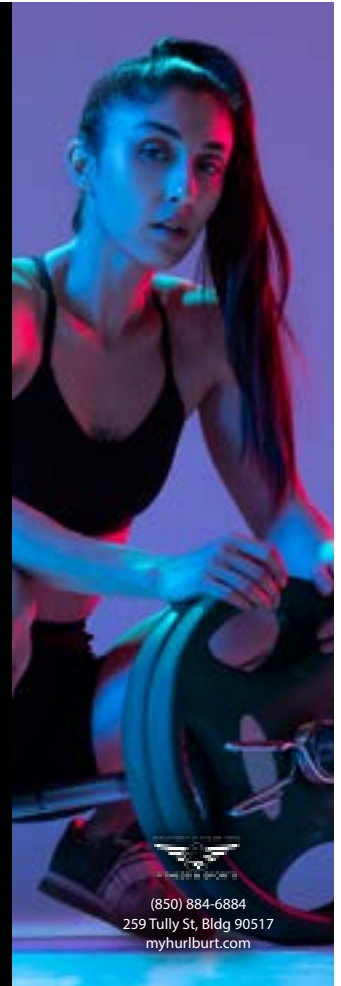

DINING AT _____ THE RIPTIDE

When it comes to dining on Hurlburt Field there are many options. One of those options, Riptide Dining Facility (DFAC), is taking your dining experience on Hurlburt a step further with guest chefs, quarterly birthday meals, specialty dining, holiday meals, and the newly formed Food Advisory Council.

We talked with Airmen currently assigned to Food Services about these new concepts and how they leverage the facility to boost morale and provide that unique dining experience on Hurlburt Field.

Last quarter the Riptide DFAC hosted the chef from La Casa Bianca in Mary Esther. The chef has over 40 years of experience and agreed to demonstrate some recipes. “We invited him to come teach the Airmen how to make different authentic Italian sauces. He made marinara, bolognese, and alfredo sauce,” shares TSgt Chester Remas, Assistant Manager, Dining Facility. He went on to say, “The chef was teaching how to make some really good stuff from scratch, to be proud of, to take home to their family. We are hoping to invite more chefs from the local area to show us new techniques and



recipes.” The Riptide DFAC team enjoys putting together new recipes utilizing these techniques, to send to the Air Force Services Center, and suggest new recipes to add to their rotation.

Another new event at the Riptide DFAC is the quarterly birthday meal. A1C Aaliyah Rawlings, Food Service Apprentice, helps to ensure the birthday meal is a fun and engaging experience. “We focus on coming up with the theme, like a Jamaican theme or a Southern theme, and our team brings it all together.” Last quarter’s meal was Southern-themed and dorm members who had birthdays in July through December were invited to attend and bring one guest. Prizes and swag were also available. “This was our first birthday meal and we had a great turnout,” said A1C Rawlings. For the next birthday meal, celebrants are invited to sign up at the Riptide Dining Facility with their name and unit. Airmen can use their Essential Station Messing (ESM) meal card and guests can pay the daily rate.

Specialty meals are another way the Riptide DFAC offers distinct meals to Hurlburt Airmen. “The Mongolian meal is prepared the 3rd Wednesday of the month,” says A1C Kevin Okello, Food Service Apprentice. For the Mongolian Meal, customers can choose one of 4 types of meat, in addition to multiple veggies that are stir-fried in the sauce of their choice. A1C Okello says, “The reason why we have the meal is to boost the morale, and offer a made-to-order dish.”

Holiday meals are another specialty offered on most Federal holidays. SSgt Mandel Elam, storeroom NCOIC, says Thanksgiving is their biggest and best meal. “We serve everything you could think of that you may have at home on Thanksgiving. Most of the other holidays are smaller in scale, but we usually make and order the most food for Thanksgiving.” Holiday meals are special when they include special guests to serve the meals. “We have an entire DV list and they sign up for it, the commander, the deputy, all the chiefs, it’s really cool to see them come in and serve food,” says SSgt Elam.

Specialty and themed meals are a direct outcome of the Food Advisory Council. TSgt Alison Hill, Manager of the Riptide DFAC, says, “At these meetings, we discuss future specialty meals and like to learn what the ESM members are craving, for example, Taco Tuesdays or more pasta. Our goal is to meet the needs of our customers and participation in the Food Advisory Council allows us to plan accordingly.” The Food Advisory Council was brought together this past year to get feedback from the airmen about what they are looking for in their dining experience on Hurlburt Field. “We open it up to our members to give us feedback, discuss quarterly birthday meal themes, and just get ideas on what customers would like to see added to our facility. We also use this time to educate members on ESM and how that program can be utilized,” says TSgt Hill. ESM members currently

assigned to Hurlburt Field can use ESM entitlements not just at the DFAC, but at other FSS NAF dining facilities on base, including the Oasis Café at the golf course, Spare Time Grill at the bowling center, the Kraken Kafé, and The Soundside Club. ESM allows one meal per meal period resulting in three meals per day. TSgt Hill says, “Our main support at the Riptide is to serve ESM members, but we’ve also opened it to civilians, contractors, family, retirees, etc.”



Compared to off-base options, the dining facility stands apart with easy access for Team Hurlburt. Prices are more affordable at the DFAC compared to off-base eateries, and for ESM members in the dorms, it is a short walk or shuttle ride to the Riptide. TSgt Hill says, “The dorm residents don’t have to ask their colleagues to take them off base to get something to eat. We offer healthy options like the Go for Green and salad bar.”



All the airmen we interviewed mentioned the one thing they enjoyed about working at the DFAC was taking pride in their work and being able to provide quality meals to not only ESM members but everyone with access to Hurlburt Field.

FACES OF THE FORCE SUPPORT SQUADRON



A1C AALIYAH RAWLINGS, FOOD SERVICE APPRENTICE

A1C Rawlings arrived at Hurlburt Field in January of 2023 and has enjoyed living close to family. “I’m only three hours away from them so I’m able to go home for important events.” When asked how someone would benefit from visiting the Riptide Dining Facility she says, “My team ensures that the food is great quality and we put pride in the food.” A1C Rawlings said she always received compliments on her cooking at home but this is her first job in food service. “This has all been a great learning experience for me, and has taught me lessons that I can take to my home kitchen.” Her favorite part about working at the DFAC is interacting with customers and learning new information about other people. “Hearing different stories from so many perspectives gives me a real idea of how big the mission is at Hurlburt Field. I can proudly say that I play a part in something big.”



TSgt ALLISON HILL, RIPTIDE DFAC MANAGER

TSgt Hill has held many positions in food services over the years. She first started as a shift leader at the Reef DFAC and then was the Contracting Representative for both the Reef and Riptide DFAC. She was placed at the Riptide DFAC as the Assistant Manager and is now the Manager. TSgt Hill enjoys the fast-paced and team-oriented nature of food operations. TSgt Hill wants patrons to know the DFAC hosts a quarterly Food Advisory Council for ESM members and anyone else who would like to attend. “During these meetings we take their suggestions about future specialty meals, the quarterly birthday meals, and if any of the Airmen have any ideas on what we can add or improve.” They also discuss any questions, concerns, or requests from the customers and explain the Campus Style Dining System used at Hurlburt Field.



A1C KEVIN OKELLO, FOOD SERVICE APPRENTICE

A1C Okello was lucky enough to get selected for one of his dream sheet bases and arrived at Hurlburt Field in December of 2022. He has been in the Food Service ever since. A1C Okello has always wanted to learn to cook. “Learning how to prep and cook different meals is my favorite part of working there.” When asked what makes Hurlburt stand out among its competitors A1C Okello said, “Our facility offers affordable meals that active military, retired military, and even civilians can come enjoy.” A1C Okello talked about what he likes most about the DFAC, “It’s been a completely new experience cooking for a large number of customers. I have learned a lot working here.”



SSgt MANDEL ELAM, STORE ROOM NCOIC

SSgt Elam has worked at the DFAC for two years with a temporary duty stop in between. “I came from Osan where I worked in food operations. When I arrived here I worked at the fitness center and when I was promoted, they asked me for help with food ops.” He says he joined the store room to be more involved in the process of ordering food. “I make sure to buy the right quantity and buy the food that people in the dorms want.”

SSgt Elam was recently part of a Mission Sustainment Team (MST) for 15 months where he trained different Air Force Specialty Codes (AFSCs) that don’t normally handle food like civil engineering (CE), cyber, communications, etc. He taught how to set and prepare food operations as part of the Multi-Capable Airman initiative. “We taught them how to set up dry kitchens and cook under a tent.” When asked about his favorite part about working at the DFAC he says, “I did an exercise with the Columbian Air Force and we served food for them out of a giant dry kitchen. Doing stuff like that makes me appreciate my work – if we hadn’t set that up they would not have eaten that day.”

RECYCLING ON

HURLBURT FIELD

“Almost everything on the planet can be recycled,” says John Winter, the Hurlburt Field Recycling Center Operations Manager. John, and his two other colleagues, work together to take on the large amount of recyclable materials the base generates daily.

Anyone who has access to Hurlburt Field has access to the center. In regards to squadrons, John says every squadron has a facility manager, and it’s important for them to know the recycling center is available. “The dissemination of current information about our operation is the hardest part. Thousands of people process through Hurlburt Field every year, so we are constantly battling with ensuring the information about our commitment to recycling is delivered to our Airmen and leaders,” says John. This information is vital to ensuring the success of the recycling program here at Hurlburt Field.



For squadrons with items sitting in a remote corner of their building or taking up space in a room that doesn't need to go to the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) or returned to its owner, don't throw it away! Bring it to the recycling center. John says, "It's our job to divert as much recyclable material from the landfill as possible."

The flip side of recycling is putting items dropped at recycling back in service. Items have been turned in to the recycling center from units that have shut down or been deactivated. "Units that might not have large budgets can swing by and see what we have," says John. "I would rather give a recycled 55-gallon drum, for example, to another unit to bolster their program and support their mission rather than process the item as a commodity."

Families starting a Permanent Change of Station (PCS) and taking on a Do It Yourself or (DITY) move could also benefit from the Recycling Center. "I'd love for them to come by and collect boxes from me as opposed to the big cardboard manufacturers," John said. The center takes boxes from your move and also gives boxes when available. The same is true for many other items you don't want to take with you on your move. John says "I think



it's more important for people to have my telephone number rather than a hard and fast list of what is recyclable because I'd rather have a conversation about it."

John states three items are required to be recycled based on the classification per the code of federal regulation: 1. Newspaper, if we have over 500 houses; 2. High-grade office paper, if we have over 100 administrative personnel, and 3. OCC or cardboard if the base generates over 10 tons per calendar month. "We do 20 tons a month of cardboard without even trying."

The bottom line is simply the existence of the recycling center. "I want people to know that the program is here to support them, and I think if they have that information along with a way of getting a hold of me, and they ask the questions I can answer them." John goes on to say, "I will recycle it if I can."

Michael says you should visit the recycling center to dispose of your recyclables and contribute to the Hurlburt recycling program. He enjoys providing information about recycling, including different types of recycling, where it should be placed, and helping Airmen divert products from the landfill that can be recycled. Michael thinks the recycling center stands apart from competitors by “utilizing our small workforce to produce a large product output, our working standards, our overall teamwork, and our positive work attitudes.”

COMPASSIONATE CARE BEYOND DUTY:

Exploring AFW2's Services for Injured Airmen and Guardians

The Air Force Wounded Warrior (AFW2) program, located at JBSA-Randolph, TX, provides non-medical care and support to wounded, seriously ill, and injured Airmen and Guardians serving active duty, Guard, and Reserves. Since its inception, AFW2 has provided service to over 14,000 Airmen and Guardians, with over 4,000 active cases and approximately 130 new personnel enrolled each month.

“The program strives to return Airmen and Guardians to duty,” said Col. Eli Mitchell, AFW2 Director. “However, that is not always possible, so in those cases, we work to provide a smooth transition for service members to civilian life as veterans.”

AFW2 provides advocacy for each wounded warrior in their unique situation through Recovery Care Coordinators (RCCs) at 43 different installations in the US and overseas. The RCCs are responsible for the personal connection with each warrior and the “boots on the ground” for the program. They help warriors navigate the challenges they may face based on their individual needs.

In addition to the personal support RCCs provide to warriors, AFW2 also offers opportunities to explore adaptive sports on a competitive level against other services, learn different skills for resiliency through art, music, or comedy, promote caregiver networking and coping skills development, and prepare those seeking employment with additional skills.

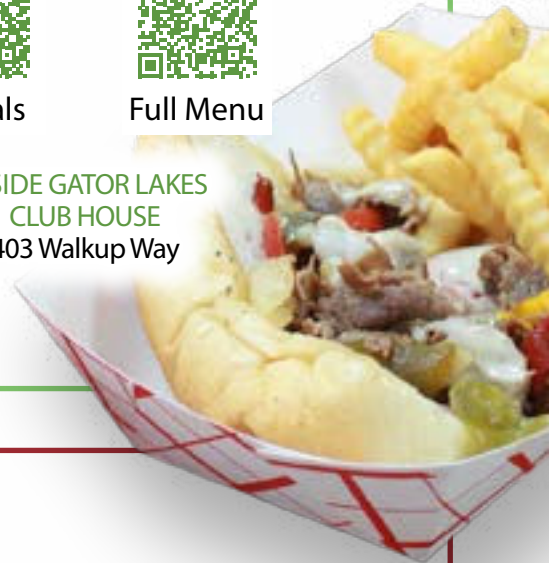

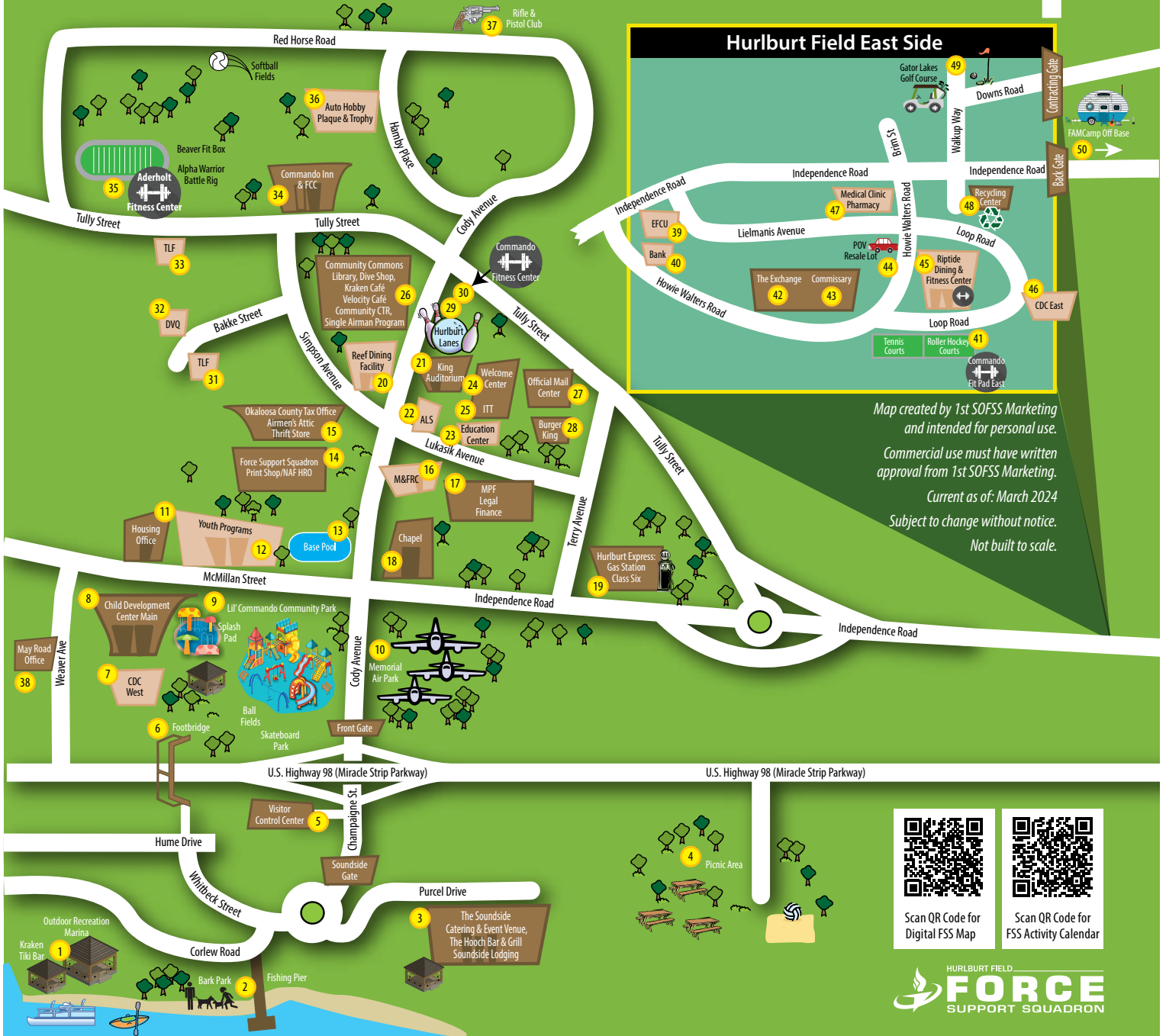
